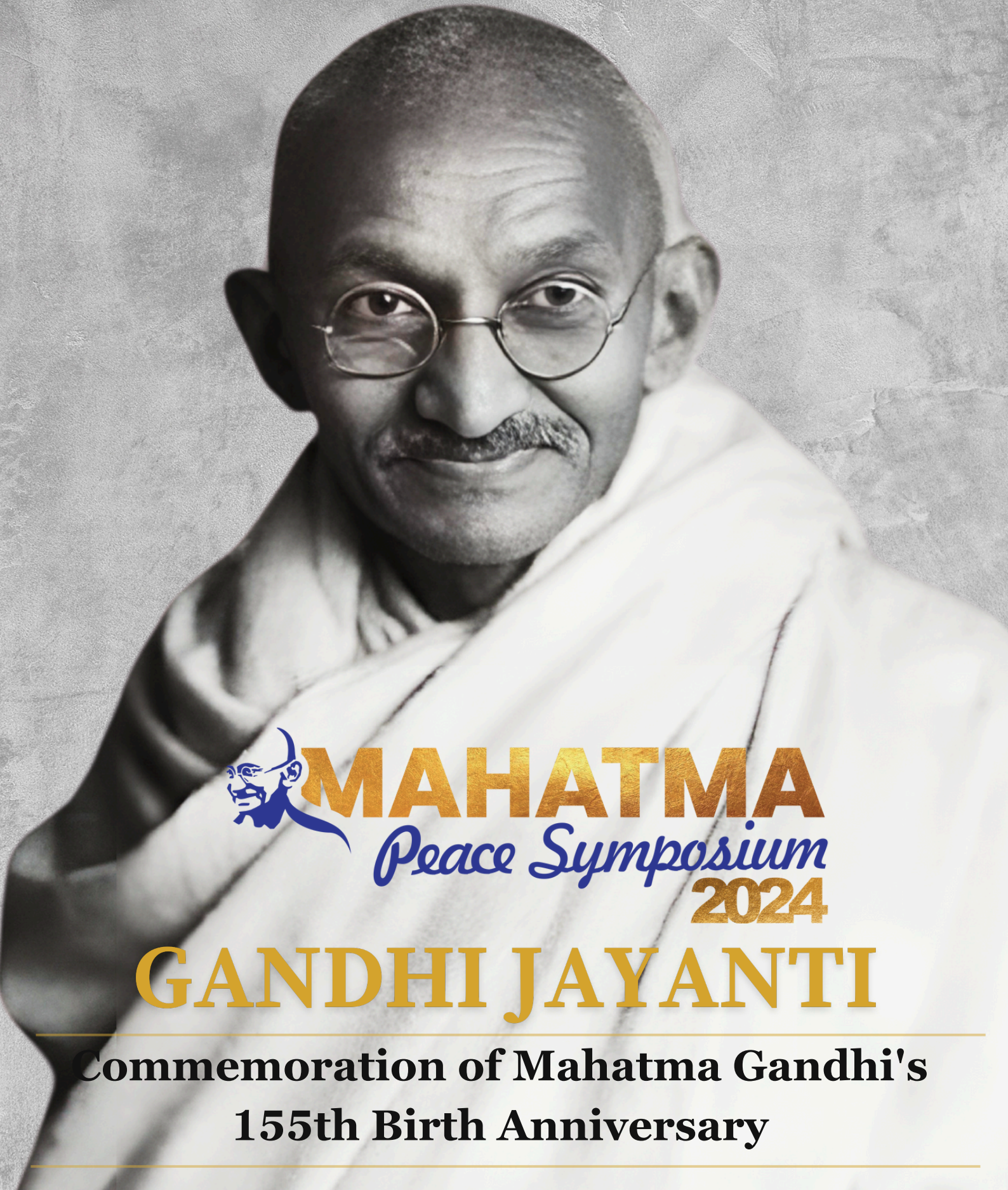

Dr Astrid Perry OAM

Head of Women, Equity and Domestic & Family Violence, SSI

Dr. Astrid Perry is the Head of Women, Equity, and Domestic and Family Violence at Settlement Services International (SSI), a leading multicultural not-for-profit NSW focused on supporting migrant, refugee, and multicultural communities. She leads the implementation of the Women and Girls Strategic Plan and has developed multiple Domestic and Family Violence projects aimed at supporting migrant and refugee women and their children. Astrid's leadership held numerous positions on advisory roles, including the TAFE Community Advisory Board and National Multicultural Advisory Committee Department of Human Services and Police Advisory Council on Ethnic Communities. Astrid holds a PhD in Sociology, a Bachelor of Social Science and several other qualifications, including a Diploma in Health Leadership. Astrid's PhD focused on gender equity in Australian schools, and she brings years of leadership experience in multicultural and women sectors to her role to RISE.



Patricia Garcia AO

Patricia Garcia AO is a human rights advocate and has worked for over 20 years in some of the world's most dangerous conflict-ridden regions including Afghanistan, Bosnia, Kosovo, Rwanda, Sudan, South Sudan and Thai-Burma border. She was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in 2016 and was a 2016 NSW Australian of the Year Awards Finalist for her contribution and services to the international humanitarian-aid & development sector. Patricia was a Human Rights Research Fellow at University of Sydney's Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies (CPACS) from 2000–2002 and designed the Human Rights course for Master of Peace and Conflict Studies at CPACS, a 2017 Rotary Peace Fellow and Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP) Partnership Development Manager. Patricia is an Honorary Associate at University of Sydney, a Sessional Lecturer on peace and human rights with a passion to advance the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Agenda.

Sex Discrimination Commissioner, Australian Human Rights Commission

Dr Cody started as Australia's Sex Discrimination Commissioner in September 2023. Before this, Dr Cody had a distinguished career as an academic, as a lawyer specialising in discrimination and as a passionate advocate for human rights. Her work over the years has included substantial advocacy to various United Nations human rights committees when they have reviewed Australia's and other nations' fulfilment of their human rights obligations. Most recently she was the Dean of the School of Law and Professor at Western Sydney University for 4.5 years, leading education and research impact within the School to better reflect the diversity of the community and the intersection of law and justice.

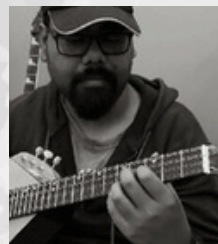

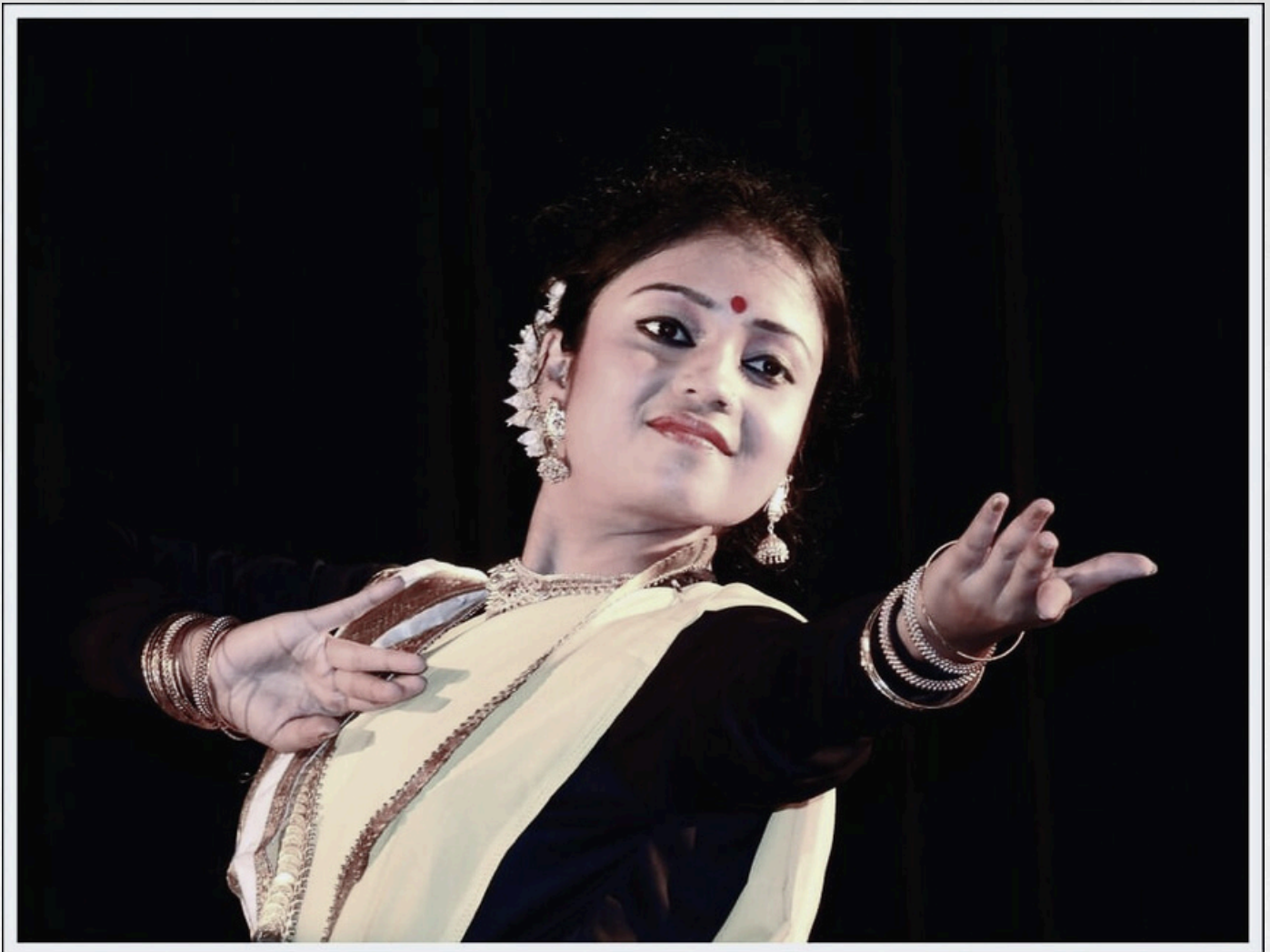
Live Cultural Performance Creatives + Artists for Peace

"I wanted the vision & themes of MAHATMA Peace Symposium - "My Land, My Story - Meri Kahaani, Meri Zabaani", an Australia-India Cultural Synergies initiative, to be articulated through Art." - Saroni Roy

Saroni worked remotely along with Award-winner First Nations artist, Presten Warren, to curate an authentic and exquisite piece of art, ensconced in the Gandhian values of Ahimsa, Sarvodaya, Swaraj, - peace, love, and reconciliation. The intricate patterns portray the Australian Indigenous peoples' journeys and camps, which span across the vast expanse of the country, representing the diverse tribes that comprise a unified nation. Moreover, the artwork incorporates the Indigenous, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flag colours & Indian flag colours, embodying the ancient Australian connection to India - the links between Australian Aboriginal and Indian tribes, aligning with the theme of India's G20 Presidency - "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth · One Family · One Future" - drawn from the ancient Sanskrit text of the 'Maha Upanishad', celebrating and strengthening Australia-India bi-lateral relations. The artwork will also be rendered on a Gajji silk saree handcrafted by the artisans of India, an Australia-India cultural synergies heritage piece, draped by Saroni.

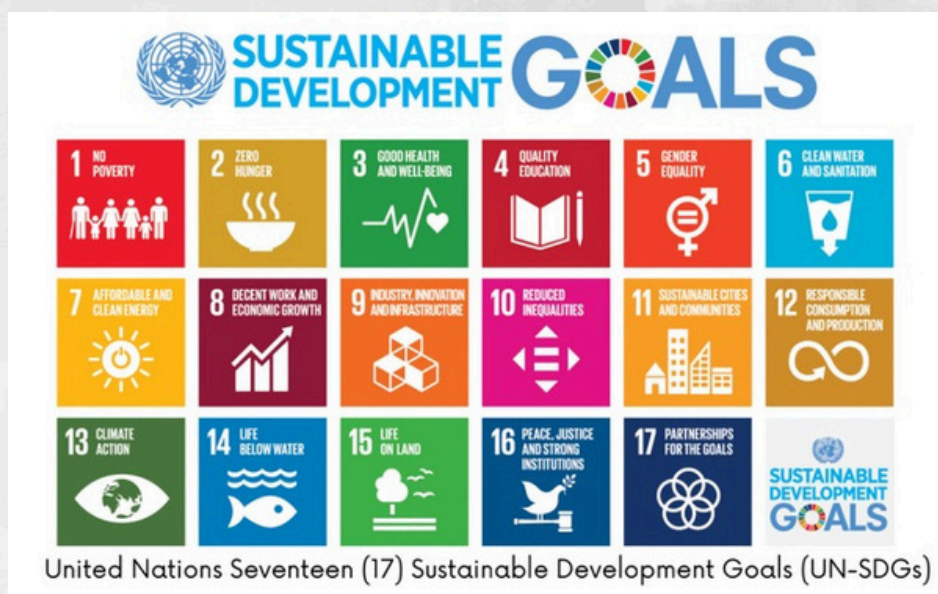
"I am an Indigenous artist living in Port Lincoln, South Australia and a proud Wirangu/Dieri/Kokatha/Mirning man. I am a descendant of the desert & ocean tribes of Australia. I am a country boy, have country blood and country in my soul. Art has always been a big part of my life. It is my outlet, my safety, my pride and my church. Art is something my family and my culture have been practising for millennia. Art provokes and stimulates something deep within us that we all share. It is a very special form of storytelling and one which is sacred to my culture. I often lose myself in my own thoughts as I tell my stories through painting. I love that we can all let our imaginations spill out onto canvas with such bewildering colours and uniquely textured details telling stories in ways that words just can't. My mother and grandmother taught me everything I know about art and I am so grateful for the passion they ignited in me. It feels good to be able to keep this important tradition alive in our family and hopefully pass it on to generations ahead."

The annual flagship initiative MAHATMA Peace Symposium (MPS) is a tribute to the global peace hero Mahatma Gandhi. It commemorates Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Anniversary (Gandhi Jayanti) and aims to increase public awareness and understanding of Mahatma Gandhi's vision of sustainability, real-development & ahimsa (non-violence) as a non-violent approach to foster lasting peace within and across diverse & vulnerable communities, thereby accelerating inclusive, networked multilateralism with vision, ambition and impact, integral for a sustainable world. With my experience of working with global peace NGOs and diaspora communities, I realised that Mahatma Gandhi is adored and worshipped as a global peace hero of history, and what we see as the UN-SDGs, are social development aspects he talked about over a century ago, and yet there was no platform that was educating today's global citizens on how to decode, simplify, implement his principles and teachings for conflict-resolution and to address pressing issues the world is facing. Therefore I created a call-to-action forum where each year MPS focuses on a social issue the world is faced with, its articulation in the UN-SDGs and how we can address them applying the Gandhian values and principles. In 2021 we addressed Global Agenda for Women, Peace & Security, in 2022 we deep dived into how Ahimsa addresses multi-dimensional poverty. In 2023 we focused on the Gandhian philosophy/concept of Satyagraha, Sarvodaya & Swaraj, and its articulation in the UN-SDGs. Raise public awareness about Gandhi's "Constructive Program", the reformulation of individual identities, social relationships, economic arrangements, and political engagement within local communities, to make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable (UN-SDG 11); and the ancient links between Australian Aboriginal and Indian tribes. Inclusive & peaceful societies lead to sustainable & prosperous economies. MPS highlights our ethos that structured peace education is key to making a paradigm shift in the way the world thinks about peace.
